Every Acre Counts

Offered through SDSU Extension, Every Acre Counts goal is to improve the farm profitability, diversity, and ecosystem benefits of agriculture by using precision technologies to empower producers to help make informed management decisions for every acre of their operations.

To achieve that, the precision data from the grower is transferred to a profitability software along with the production input costs, crop market price, and variable rate fertilizer or seeding maps available. When all the data is collected, a report is generated to show the producer the profitability throughout the field and see it as an acre-by-acre profit/loss map instead of an averaged field-by-field representation.

When marginal land, such as saline soils is prevalent, conservation program examples are created to show what could happen to the field's profit, expense reduction, and ROI if the marginal lands were removed from crop production and enrolled into partner conservation programs.
